

# Accessibility Checklist

Able bodied people are not the default. We *encourage* all shoots/castings/shows to have ADA compliant spaces, regardless of whether or not a model with a disability is being hired to be on set. We **require** ADA compliant spaces, as well as a review of the below notes, for all disabled models.

- ADA Compliant building
- If there is an elevator, is there an elevator maintenance contact, should the elevator be inoperable for any reason? If so, who? \_\_\_\_\_
  - If not, is there a contingency plan should the elevator be inoperable?
- Is the accessible entrance in a reasonable location (ie, the front of the building, rather than a loading dock or area with garbage, etc)?
- If there is a ramp, does it have a railing?
- Is the bathroom easily accessible, nearby, with doors and stalls wide enough to accommodate a wheelchair user?
- Are other models with accessibility requirements also being requested?
- Has the studio/location/building manager confirmed all of the above notes?
- If for any reason the model is turned away due to inaccessibility, car expenses to/from will be charged as well as any applicable fees associated with the model request, including any confirmed session or usage fees for a booking. If the model is turned away from a casting, a \$250 fee will be incurred.
